"Some seed fell on rich soil, and produced fruit."
(Matthew 13:8)



The sower went out to sow. I grew up having a large garden in our yard. In the springtime, my father carefully plowed and tilled the area. The seeds were carefully placed neatly in rows. It was nothing like this sower who just seems to sow as he is walking. Look where it landed? The seeds landed on the path, on rocky ground, among thorns, and in good soil. Is this sower careless, or is there another message?

Later, Jesus explains that the seed is the Word of God. What if we looked at it as the abundance of God? God's desire to communicate is so strong that God takes chances and sows the Word wherever possible. God plants the message in our hearts. God has shared his gifts with me.
